Roscoe Village Neighborhood Watch Committee

Since its formation in 1977, Roscoe Village Neighbors has been a tireless advocate for the residents and business owners of our very special "Village Within the City." The committee works closely with other community organizations, elected officials, law enforcement, urban planners, education experts, attorneys, AIA-member architects, and state, county, and city agencies to fulfill its commitment to doggedly represent the interests of the neighborhood.

That commitment includes enhancing the safety and security of everyone who lives, works, and plays in Roscoe Village, which is accomplished through the Neighborhood Watch Committee. These efforts include monitoring crime trends and communicating safety alerts, implementing the NOW Network, a cloud-based camera platform, attending meetings with other community safety groups and our local 19th Police District and other law enforcement agencies, and escalating safety concerns to the appropriate group or official.

RVN Zoning & Land Use Committee

The RVN Zoning & Land Use Committee is another integral part of our organization. Comprised of urban planners, AIA architects, attorneys, and others who live in the Village, the Zoning Committee is charged with advocating RVN's "Statement of Principles Regarding Land Use, Development, and Zoning".


The Zoning Committee's origins reach back to the earliest days of RVN. In fact, RVN was one of the very first organizations in Chicago to sponsor an independent Master Planning Study of its neighborhood. It has resulted in the preservation of many of the interior streets of the Village containing affordable single, 2, 3 and multiple family buildings. In addition, it was instrumental in today's Roscoe Street SD-10 overlay district, and its official designation by the Chicago Zoning Ordinance as a "pedestrian street". The Ordinance recognized Roscoe Street as an excellent example of an urban pedestrian-oriented shopping district.

Here are some examples of RVN's Planning Successes RVN was actively engaged as a neighborhood stakeholder in many projects. There are a number of larger planning issues that merit specific mention.

Among them are:

Western Avenue Viaduct Removal and Study– RVN strongly supported removal of the viaduct and its replacement with surface streets. To proactively capitalize on redevelopment possibilities when the viaduct was removed, RVN retained The Lakota Group and



Goodisman Williams Group as consultants. This resulted in solutions that maintained good traffic flow, removed the dangerous eyesore of the overpass and revitalized the Village.

Addison Corridor Master Plan – This is a large-scale Master Plan envisioned for a green-focused business development with public amenities along the Chicago River stretching from Diversey Avenue to Irving Park Road, including the 312 River Run. While the project will take years to complete, we continue to support the plan as developed to date.

CHA Lathrop Homes Redevelopment – RVN, as a community stakeholder and a member of the Lathrop Homes Working Group, participated in the restoration of the affordable rental housing and historically protected open green space along the Chicago River.

Riverview Shopping Center Renovation – RVN participated in this redevelopment planning process, expressing neighborhood concerns and incorporated solutions into the proposed plan.

Meet the Roscoe Village Neighbors Education Committee

Did you know Roscoe Village Neighbors has an Education Committee? The RVN Ed. Committee mission "Strengthening Education Through Community" aims to enhance Roscoe Village by directly supporting neighborhood schools.

The RVN Ed. Committee primarily provides financial support to schools. Schools can seek funding for projects and the committee vets grant proposals and makes recommendations to the RVN board as to whether to fund the grants. - · Revising and revamping the grant application process
- Creating an outreach plan to schools to insure they are aware of the grant process and increase diversity in school representation on the committee
- Exploring new projects like a junior RVN board and student internships


Join a reading group with Roscoe Books located in the heart of the village!
